#### Caleb Village – North Battleford

On November 21, 2020 Caleb Village North Battleford announced that a resident had passed away at the home. The resident had underlying health problems and was receiving palliative care from the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) prior to the COVID-19 outbreak. Caleb Management Ltd. expresses our most sincere condolences to the family on the loss of their loved one. Currently, the SHA is not reporting this as a COVID-19 related death.

As of November 22, 2020, there are 10 residents that have tested positive for COVID-19 at Caleb Village in North Battleford, two of which are in hospital, and a third resident that is considered recovered. There are seven active cases in the home. In addition, two close contacts have also tested positive. All residents and Caleb employees have been tested and continue to be tested as they report symptoms. Caleb employees have all tested negative and continue to be symptom free.

Management and staff of Caleb Village North Battleford continue to follow the measures set out by the SHA's OUTBREAK protocol, including daily monitoring of residents and employees for symptoms, ensuring that further testing is completed as required and participating in the Outbreak Management daily conference calls. Caleb Village employees continue to use the appropriate PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) for contact droplet precautions. The home is closed to visitors at this time, allowing only those visitors for compassionate reasons.

Caleb Management Ltd. would like to remind everyone to continue to follow the guidelines set out by the SHA to control the spread of the virus – wash your hands, wear a mask in public, keep your social circle small (no more than 5 in your household), refrain from attending gatherings, and limit non-essential travel and shopping.

And we ask that if you are unwell, and showing any flu like symptoms, to please call 811, arrange for a COVID-19 test and self-isolate and self-monitor for 14 days. Please do not visit seniors' homes or places where care and support are being provided. Also, if you have been to any of the locations listed as potential exposure to COVID-19, businesses or communities, self-monitor **at home** for signs of illness for at least 14 days.

Everyone must do their part to ensure that our loved ones are always protected.
