



Dec. 16th, 2020 – **Outbreak declared OVER** by the Saskatchewan Health Authority

The Saskatchewan Health Authority has declared the COVID-19 Outbreak over as of December 16th, 2020.

Caleb Village in North Battleford has been in Outbreak status since November 11th, 2020 – some 36 days. There were 11 residents and 2 close contacts that tested positive for COVID-19 during the outbreak.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents of Caleb Village – North Battleford for your patience and understanding during this most difficult time. We also extend our most sincere appreciation for the dedication and commitment of *our employees who all tested negative for COVID-19 and remained symptom free throughout the outbreak*. We also would like to recognize Shannon Langley, the General Manager for Caleb Village in North Battleford. Shannon's leadership and unwavering attention to detail provided both staff and residents with assurances that together, we would make it through the outbreak.

Caleb Village in North Battleford will continue to be closed to visitors, allowing only those essential visitors that can support the resident's immediate health and wellbeing needs. The dining room will re-open and activities will resume after careful review. Residents are free to leave their suites and must wear a mask while in the common areas. All residents must continue to keep a physical distance from each other of no less than 2 meters. We also ask that residents that are unwell, to remain in their suite and call the front desk for further instructions.

Caleb Management Ltd. would like to remind everyone to continue to follow the guidelines set out by the SHA to control the spread of the virus – wash your hands, wear a mask in public, stay home, refrain from attending gatherings, and limit non-essential travel and shopping. The virus does not move unless we move. Please rethink your outings and excursions to those only medically necessary or considered essential. The outbreak has been very difficult on our residents and their families and our employees. When everyone follows the provincial direction and continues to stay home when sick, we can better protect our most vulnerable population, the elderly.
